Coach's Corner

The Pendulum Delivery

There is much talk about the position of your feet and the importance of keeping your shoulders square, so that the arm does not stray off the delivery line when preparing to bowl. However, too often I see bowlers pick up their bowl and keep both hands on it, right up to the time of delivery.

The problem is that, in the majority of cases, this results in the bowl being held in front of the body instead of being held to the side of the body, along the delivery line. This means that the delivery arm is not able to make a pendulum swing up and down in a straight path along the delivery line. The arm has to curve back round the hip and then hope to swing forward on the right line.

The remedy is simple. Once you have the bowl settled in your right hand, take the left hand off the bowl so you can rest it on your left knee (for a right handed bowler) as you step forward to make the delivery. Before you take that step, your delivery arm should be to the side of your body aiming along the chosen delivery line so you can then simply swing your arm backwards and forwards in a pendulum motion knowing that you are much more likely to achieve a good, accurate delivery.

Please ask any of our coaches to demonstrate, if that would help you to get it right.
